It's been a good couple weeks for the Brayton family.

Today, UC Berkeley Professor Robert Brayton won the Phil Kaufman Award for Distinguished Contributions to Electronic Automation Design today. The award is presented annual by a consortium of companies that provide design tools and by IEEE.

Brayton's son, Jim Brayton, is the project manager for Intel's next overhaul of its chip architecture, code-named Nehalem. Jim Brayton -- who works in Hillsboro -- demonstrated the new technology at Intel's developer conference in San Francisco last week.
