

IEEE CEDA Student Travel Grant Program

Travel Grant reimbursement policy – Important information :

- IEEE CEDA Student Travel Grants are awarded as reimbursements after receipts are submitted. Your expense report and receipts must be submitted using the [NextGen Expense Reimbursement system](#) (also known as Concur) **within 30 days after the event and no later than Nov. 20 of the current year (for conferences taking place before that date).**
- The spirit behind the CEDA Student Travel Grants is to provide a financial support to allow students travel to conferences, who would otherwise have no means of funding their trip to the conference. Therefore, student travel grants **can solely cover expenses incurred by the grantee**. A responsible and sensible use of the grant is required: in no cases the student travel grants can be shared with other students or used to pay any cost to a third person.
- In order to apply for the reimbursement, you must register in the system with your IEEE Student Membership into Concur. To do so, you will need to follow all the steps provided in this link:
 - <https://corporate.ieee.org/resources/travel,-medical-and-insurance/ieee-expense-report>Follow the instructions provided on the link above to create an account (linked to your IEEE student account) to then access concur to submit your expenses.
- In this system, in order to be approved by IEEE CEDA, it is needed to include PDFs or images of all the receipts according to the initial approved budget of expenses for the Student Travel Grant. All expenses submitted for reimbursement need to be in the applicant's name with full name and date of purchase visible.
- **The total amount of expenses claimed in your IEEE Concur expense report should not exceed the grant that was given to you.** An expense report exceeding the maximum amount of your grant will be send back to you for correction, with the subsequent delays in the payment procedure.
- If IEEE CEDA has questions about any of the expenses, the submitted form in IEEE Concur will be returned to you for clarification. Thus, please include clear descriptions of the itemized expenses that match the approved budget in the Student Travel Grant.
- All expenses need to be compliant with the IEEE Travel Reimbursement guidelines, which can be found in this link: <https://www.ieee.org/content/dam/ieee-org/ieee/web/org/travel-expense-reimbursement-guidelines.pdf>
Failure to comply with this guidelines will result **in expenses not being reimbursed**.

Steps for creating your travel expense report in Concur:

Once you have set up your account in Concur, access the system using this link: <https://ieee.org/concur>

Note: You cannot access via the site concur.com (typing “Concur” on google will not lead you to the correct link).

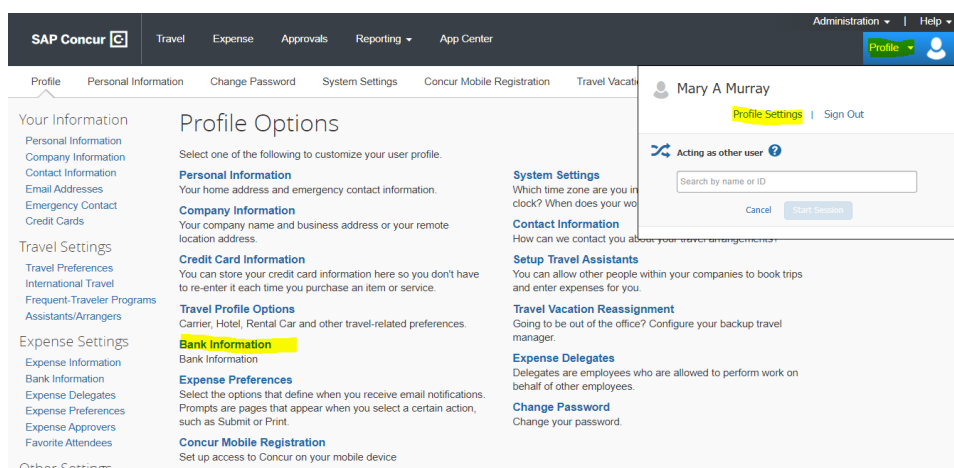
The steps you need to take to create your report are the following:

1. If you are a first-time user in Concur, make sure to complete your Personal Information in the “Profile” tab, as well as your bank information.
2. If you reside in a country where either USD (US Dollar), EUR (Euro), CAD (Canadian Dollar) or INR (Indian Ruppee) is considered the local currency, you must enter your banking

information directly into Concur (select Profile > Profile Settings > Bank information), as shown on the image below.

If your currency is NOT one of the four listed above, you will need to complete a one-time enrollment with Western Union in order to receive electronic reimbursements from IEEE. To enroll, please [complete the required registration form](#). Enter your 8-digit IEEE member number in the "Payee ID" field.

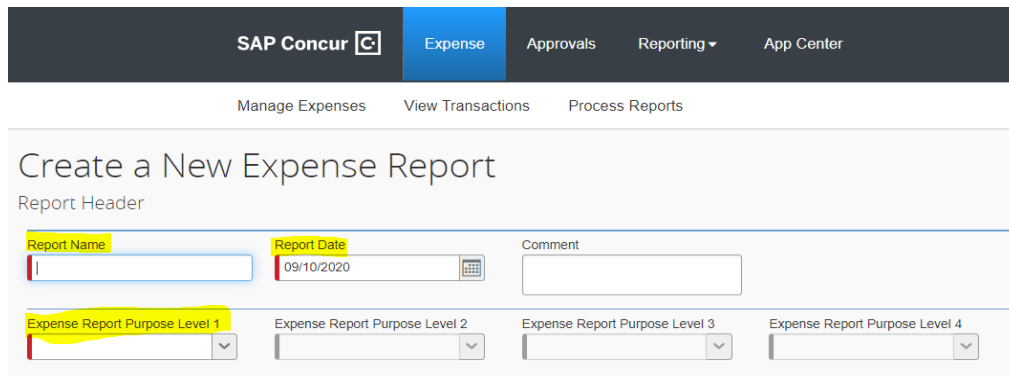

3. Create a new expense report by going to the "Expenses" tab and hitting on "Create New Claim".
4. You will need to fill-in the Expense Report Header below. This is an **very important step** that needs to be done carefully to ensure your expense report reaches the right approver.

Please make sure to:

- Choose a meaningful report name
- Expense report purpose Level 1: **Technical Activities Societies**
- Expense report purpose Level 2: **Electronic Design Auto. Council**
- Expense report purpose Level 3: **Student Support**
- Expense report purpose Level 4: **00000**



5. Create new expenses by adding them to the correct category and attaching the receipt. Make sure to correctly set the transaction date. For flight tickets, this date should match the date of issuance of the ticket.

6. **The expenses claimed in your expense report should match exactly the amount of the grant that was given to you.** For instance, if you were given USD1'000 as a grant, then the expense report should not exceed USD1'000. If you are claiming expenses in another currency, you should do the currency conversion yourself.

Please note:

- It is up to you to choose which expenses you claim. For instance, if you have two invoices, one for hotel of \$600, and one for a flight of \$1'100, you can: 1) claim \$500 for flights and \$500 for hotels, or (2) claim \$600 for hotel, plus \$400 for flights, or (3) \$1000 for flights.
 - If one expense alone exceeds the maximum amount of your grant, you should cap the cost to the maximum amount.
 - Any expense report exceeding the maximum amount of your grant will be send back to you for correction, which involves delays in the payment procedure.
7. Once all expenses have been entered into Concur, you can **submit** your expense report. Once you have done that, you will be able to check the approval flow (go to your expense report and click on “Details → Approval Flow”, and also view the estimated date of payment by clicking on “Details → Report Payments”.
